

Area has become a busy place for large machinery and trucks as Meierotto's Jewelry breaks ground for their new headquarters.

During the month of December, a couple of awaited projects will come to completion.

The restaurant at the Chicken N Pickle will open offering a variety of foods, beverages, and entertainment. Construction on Phase IV of the Gardens Apartments at Northgate Village will be completed and residents will begin calling the building home. BIKE SHARE IS COMING TO NORTH KANSAS CITY!



Kansas City B-Cycle is a 24/7 public bike share system, designed for short trips. Users purchase a ride online or at any station (minimum \$3 for 30 minutes), and may return the bike to any B-Cycle station. There are currently 30 stations in Kansas City, MO and the City of North Kansas City will be the first to install stations north of the river.



ARMOUR ROAD REDEVELOPMENT UPDATE

The City has been working toward the redevelopment of the Armour Road Redevelopment Area (south of Armour Road and east of I-35) for several years, and we are thrilled to see development of this area beginning this winter. There are currently two projects underway, with another to start soon.

On the east side, where the Sutherland's building once stood, a private company is finishing environmental remediation work. Once this work is completed, the property will be ready for new construction.

On the west side, Meierotto's Jewelry has started the site grading necessary for the construction of their new headquarters jewelry store. The new store will be an approximately 35,000 square foot building that is planned to open in the Fall of 2017.

In addition to these projects, the City will open bids for street construction on December 1. The first phase of street construction will include the reconstruction of Taney south of Armour; Mill Street, the new interior street for the redevelopment area; and a new right turn lane on Armour Road. This construction project will begin after January 1.

FIRE DEPARTMENT RECOGNITION AWARD CEREMONY

On Thursday, November 17, The North Kansas City Fire Department held their annual Recognition Award Ceremony. At the ceremony all new department personnel took the Oath of Office, several employees were presented their new badge in honor of promotions they received over the past 12 months, and recognition awards were given to those who went above and beyond to serve the community of North Kansas City. More than 125 people were in attendance and the ceremony was a huge success.



DON'T GET SCAMMED

Financial scams targeting seniors are a real problem when it comes to crime prevention. Financial scams that target our senior population are not new, seem to be cyclical, and target both financially stable and low-income seniors alike. The general thought as to why our senior population is targeted is they are more trusting of people, sometimes lonely, less technologically savvy, and un-willing to report when they have been victimized due to their embarrassment and fear of losing independence from their families. Within the past year alone, North Kansas City has seen remodeling scams, IRS scams, family member needing help scams, and telecommunication scams offering the promise of a large monetary prize in exchange for a processing fee and relinquishing personal/financial information.

Here are the top 10 financial scams targeting the elderly as reported by the National Council on Aging:

1. Medicare/health insurance scams
2. Counterfeit prescription drugs
3. Funeral & Cemetery Scams
4. Fraudulent anti-aging products
5. Telemarketing/phone scams
6. Internet fraud
7. Investment schemes
8. Homeowner/reverse mortgage scams
9. Sweepstakes and Lottery scams
10. The grandparent scam



The North Kansas City Police Department would also add the unsolicited home repair scam to this list. As a reminder to any of these scams is "that if it seems too good to be true it probably is". A person should be wary if anyone contacts them unsolicited regarding products or services.

If you suspect that you've been the victim of a scam don't be afraid to talk to a family member, a trusted friend, representatives of your bank and local law enforcement. Doing nothing could make it worse for you and others if the scammer is not caught.

DID YOU KNOW?

The North Kansas City Police Department participates in the Metropolitan Major Case Squad (Metro Squad).

The Metro Squad was the proposal of retired FBI agent and Kansas City, Missouri Chief of Police Clarence M. Kelley. Chief Kelley, through his experience of working with other law enforcement executives in the area, recognized that crime and criminals knew no geographic boundaries, with a significant number of unsolved violent crimes throughout the metropolitan area, and small agencies which lacked the staffing resources necessary to adequately conduct an investigation. Chief Kelley suggested the Police Chiefs and Sheriffs Association form a major case squad to investigate these crimes. The Police Chiefs and Sheriffs Association agreed to call the team of investigators The Metro Squad.

On January 27, 1964, 91 area detectives graduated from the first Metro Squad School. The North Kansas City Police Department's own Police Chief Steve Beamer was last year's president of the Metropolitan Chiefs and Sheriffs Association and board member of the Metro Squad. The North Kansas City Police Department currently has 9 Metro Squad-trained investigators in its ranks.



COUNCILMEMBERS, CITY TREASURER AND MAYOR UP FOR ELECTION

Filing for the April 4, 2017 Municipal Election will begin on Tuesday, December 13, 2016, at 8:00 a.m. in the City Clerk's office located at City Hall, 2010 Howell Street in North Kansas City and filing will close on January 17, 2017, at 5:00 p.m. This year's election is for one Councilmember from each ward, the City Treasurer and the Mayor.

The following positions are up for election this year:

Ward 1:	Councilmember	2 year term
Ward 2:	Councilmember	2 year term
Ward 3:	Councilmember	2 year term
Ward 4:	Councilmember	2 year term
	City Treasurer	2 year term
	Mayor	4 year term

Councilmembers must be at least twenty-one years of age prior to taking office, a citizen of the United States, and an inhabitant of the city for one year preceding the election, and a resident of the ward from which he/she is elected six months next preceding the election. Councilmembers represent the interests of their constituents and citizens at large in matters before the City. City Council meetings are held the first and third Tuesdays of each month. Work sessions are frequently held at 6:00 p.m., and Regular Council Meetings begin at 7:00 p.m.

The Mayor must be at least thirty years of age, a citizen of the United States and a resident of the city at the time of and for two years preceding the election. The Mayor presides over the City Council. The Mayor does not vote except to break a tie. The Mayor is in overall charge of the affairs of the city, and ensures that the ordinances of the city and the state laws relating to the city are complied with.

The City Treasurer must be a qualified voter under the laws and constitution of Missouri and a resident of the city. The City Treasurer is a member of the Police and Fire Pension Board and attests that sufficient funds are on hand to meet the obligations of the payables ordinance.

Anyone interested in running for a City office must present to the City Clerk's office in person to complete Candidacy forms. You should bring a photo ID and there is a \$5.00 filing fee. If you have any questions, please contact Crystal Doss, City Clerk, at 816-412-7815.
