NEW SIGNAGE COMES TO NORTH KANSAS CITY

FALL 2016

Earlier this year, the City Council approved a plan for the construction of new gateway signage at key entrances into North Kansas City. This new signage is in response to the City's recent branding study, which found that many people in the metro area aren't aware of North Kansas City as a separate community. Even people who pass through NKC every day have little awareness of NKC's location in the metro. The goal of new gateway signage is to provide a visual entrance into the city for residents and visitors and help reinforce NKC's location and difference from KCMO.

The City Council worked with Confluence, a landscape architecture firm, and Dimensional Innovations, a design and fabrication company, on the design of the new signs and proposed locations. Four locations have been chosen for new signage – 210 Highway & Chouteau, Armour Road & I-35, the north end of Burlington near the Children's Fountain, and Armour Road near Burlington. These four locations were all identified as key entrances into the city (or, in the case of Armour & Burlington, into downtown NKC). The Council also plans future refurbishment of the existing sign at Burlington & 10th Avenue. New gateway signs will be installed annually, beginning with the sign at Armour Road and I-35, which should be installed later this year.



The design of the new signs includes both vertical and horizontal sign designs, depending on the amount of space available at each gateway location. The new signs will incorporate metal components, with a weathered steel finish for the body of the signs, as an acknowledgement of the city's industrial history, and will use the official seal as a decorative emblem. The signs will include energy-efficient lighting to create an attractive evening appearance. In addition, the City is working with Confluence on the design of a gateway arch design to be used on Armour Road as the gateway into downtown NKC.

New gateway signs provide an opportunity to improve our identity in the area as well as beautifying key corridors and welcoming visitors to our community.

Every Smoke Alarm Has An Expiration Date: What's Yours?

Fire Prevention Week October 9 - 15

North Kansas City Fire Department urges all North Kansas City residents to know how old their smoke alarms are, and to replace them every 10 years.

Does your home have a smoke alarm? According to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), the answer is likely yes: NFPA research shows that most American homes have at least one, but do you know how old your smoke alarms are? If you're like most people, you're probably not so sure.

A recent survey conducted by NFPA revealed that only a small percentage of people (5%) know how old their smoke alarms are, or how often they need to be replaced. That lack of awareness is a concern for the North Kansas City Fire Department and NFPA, along with fire departments throughout the country, because smoke alarms don't last forever.

NFPA 72, National Fire Alarm Code®, requires smoke alarms to be replaced at least every 10 years, but because the public is generally unaware of this requirement, many homes have smoke alarms past their expiration date, putting people at increased risk.

As the official sponsor of Fire Prevention Week for more than 90 years, NFPA is promoting this year's Fire Prevention Week campaign, "Don't Wait - Check the Date! Replace Smoke Alarms Every 10 Years," to better educate the public about the critical importance of knowing how old their smoke alarms are and replacing them once they're 10 years old. Fire Prevention Week is October 9-15, 2016.

To find out how old your smoke alarm is and its expiration date, simply look on the back of the alarm where the date of manufacture is marked. The smoke alarm should be replaced 10 years from that date (not the date of purchase). The North Kansas City Fire Department also says smoke alarms should be tested monthly, and that batteries should be replaced once a year or when they begin to chirp, signaling that they're running low, unless equipped with a sealed 10 year battery.

Fire Department Training



New Recreation Center Coming to NKC

In early 2016 the City Council approved a site for a new Recreation Center. It will be located in Macken Park off Clark Ferguson Drive, between the soccer field and the Wheel Park trail. The new Recreation Center will have offices for Parks and Recreation staff, a game room, classroom, and a dividable multipurpose room with a kitchen. This new facility will host the Parks and Recreation senior, youth and adult programs. Rooms will be available to rent for meetings, luncheons and other gatherings. An architect has been retained to design the project, and the new Center is expected to open in mid-2017.
